






TEAM OF COMMITTED DOCTORS FROM SPINE FOUNDATION

They say, "Once a sportsman, always a sportsman." He has not only won numerous, national and international Awards and Medals in sports, but also in the 'battle' of life, our very own one-man-army has instilled friends with Spinal Cord Injury with 'ammunition' of confidence and self-reliance.

He has shown that life is worth living to the fullest by meeting its challenges with courage By setting up a Sports Activity Centre at Paraplegic Rehabilitation Centre - Kirkee, Pune. He continues to inspire others to be healthy, fit and self-reliant.

Nina Foundation salutes his 'never-say-die', positive attitude, determination and leadership skills. It is proud to present him the Rockstar Award on 25th June 2016, its 8th Spinal Injury Day in Mumbai.



NINA FOUNDATION is strongly committed to its mission of rehabilitation of friends with spinal cord injury and has instituted the ROCKSTAR AWARD to recognise that individual who has, with exemplary courage, faced and won the battles in life in spite of having spinal cord injury. The awardee is chosen without bias, i.e. irrespective of geographic, religious, linguistic or ethnic differences.

By presenting this Rockstar Award, Nina Foundation "Renews the spirit of life". It is proud that this achiever also encourages others to reach the top in whatever vocations they choose. Iss saal yeh shaks, mananiya Antony Das Melkias Pereira hai, jo bamey itnee sphoortee detaa bai. This year, 2016 our 8th Rockstar Awardee is none other than Antony Das Melkias Pereira who infinitely inspires us and who we can and do look up to. We salute him!

David Gergen said, "A leader's role is to raise people's aspirations for what they can become and to release their energies so they will try to get there."

Recommended by Medical Director, Paraplegic Rehabilitation Centre, Kirkee (PRC), Dr. (Col) R. K. Mukherjee saw him as a Dronacharya of PRC. Seeing his positive attitude, cheerfulness, potential and exemplary confidence, he created a leader. Antony Das Melkias Pereira was born on March 30, 1945. Pre-independence



days made all boys dream of joining the Indian Army and Antony was no different. After finishing his schooling, he joined 4-Engineer Regiment (Madras Engineer Group) of the Army in 1963 and in 1970 he met the light of his life and took his church vows when he married Recithal Pereira.

A bomb shelling during Indo-Pak War in Bangladesh in 1971 left him devastated and he had to retire and return home due to spinal cord injury. With dreams shattered and his course of life taking a new turn, he was not discouraged. "The ideal man bears the accidents of life with dignity and grace, making the best of circumstances" said Aristotle. Antony, was this ideal and courageous one-man army who believed that disability was a matter of

perception and that he could be of great assistance to others by proving his mettle and excellence.

Antony Pereira, among 12, enrolled in the first batch at PRC, Kirkee inaugurated by then President of India, Shri Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed in 1974 at the age of 24 after which he had to live with injury at Fr D12 and L1 with non-progressive vet permanent damage and restricted to the wheelchair. This Centre was started to rehabilitate injured soldiers, sailors and airmen that would enable these honorable men to live an independent and close-to-normal life. After his rehab that gave him medical care and training for financial independence, Antony Pereira worked as a stores clerk and also set up a Sports Activities Centre for which he received all support from the management. He says what he is today his thanks to them all! By proving himself and turning his disability into ability, he paved a very different new path for others to follow Great, Antony we are very, very proud of you!

Antony proved what John Quincy Adams said, "If your actions inspire others to dream more, learn more, do more, and become more, you are a leader." By becoming one, he proved that Medical Director, Dr. (Col) R. K. Mukherjee was indeed right!

Awards and recognition came non-stop. Shri Shiv Chattrapati Puraskar in 1979, National Award as best disabled sportsman not once but thrice - in 1982, 1987 and 1998. Apang Kalyankari Sewa Award in 2002 and Shahu Modak Award in 2013.

This was not all! Some more national sports medals were awarded to him (or should we say 'collected' by him), if one could put it humorously? His kitty already has a total of 143 medals: 122 gold, 18 silver and 3 bronze. He also won the National Championship when he captained Maharashtra Team in 2014 and 2015. Further, he won first place in the 5-km sea-swimming competition held in Mumbai.

What about international sports medals? A total of 8 with a gold and 7 silver medals. He represented India in the Far East South Pacific Games at Hong Kong in 1982, in 1989 at Kobe, Japan, in 1999 at Bangkok, Thailand, at Busan, Korea and Malaysia in 2006 as captain of Indian Wheelchair Basket Ball Team in Malaysia. We are all very proud that you represent India, Antony!

And this year, he has another award from Nina Foundation, the covetous Rockstar Award. Hearty Congratulations!

An inspiration to all! He truly is a beacon and lighthouse to all and especially our SCI friends by exemplifying that irrespective of disability anyone can touch the sky and fly over the horizon and be capable of proving their intrinsic worth by perseverance. That anyone can and must convert their disability into THISability.

He is truly a paradigm and has made not only PRC proud by becoming their star sportsman but also to us all at Nina Foundation. On the professional front, he is in-charge of the Vocational Training Shelter Workshop of PRC, Kirkee, where he trains, guides new entrants and encourages them to lead a normal life where confidence and self-reliance is most important. The highlight of his mission is to combine work and play-physical fitness, good workout with financial independence. To not let disability hamper the heart's dream.

Today, we salute Antony Das Melkias Pereira, our precious Rockstar, actually our 'Bruce Lee': for he truly is our very own laser-like focused soldier, maybe front and field of life. Being the youngest, she enjoyed being extra-loved and spoilt. She was kept longer at home away from her brother and sister who studied in Amravati. Instead she spent playing with dolls and 'ghar-ghar'. Her first teacher, Meenatai Charode was instrumental in her basic education in which she helped make up for a late start!



She says the best two years of her life were when she started her M. Sc. study as her coterie included her strong-bonded family and close friends. A South India trip made her see new places, experience new cultures and meet new people, too. However, higher studies were possible only with Ketna's encouragement and hope and, books and financial support coming from Nina Foundation helped her complete B. Ed. through Tompe College and M. Sc. with a first class. Employed as a lecturer at Vidyabharati University and a salary of ₹640 made her feel special and independent. Denis Waitley said, "There are two primary choices in life; to accept conditions as they exist, or accept the responsibility for changing them".

She shared her desire to work with her brother. He supported her and she worked for two years thereafter and enjoyed every moment of it. Ominous divine intervention with exciting news came through her friend

who informed her that admission for M. Phil at the Alagappa University, Chennai had opened. This made her proceed to enroll for further study. This changed the course of her life.

Being eligible for marriage, proposals with demands for dowry poured in. Disillusioned with such demand, she told her brother she would break the social norm and give approval, only if dowry was not precondition and that she is allowed to continue her work after marriage. This was impossible in her village and society would not permit her so. She decided to fall back on her original plan to study further. To get books for study, she enrolled as lecturer in Jagdamba University at Achalpurand in Vasantrao Naik University at Dharni. Thus began her work and study, finishing her 2nd year exams of M. Phil. at the age of 27.

There was a family wedding in Mumbai for which the entire, large, joint family travelled together. It was here, that while drying clothes on the terrace, tired and needing some rest she sat on the parapet, only to lose balance and fall off onto a concrete slab injuring herself at D12 L1 on April 30, 2007. Rushed to the hospital, Dr. Vinayak Joshi performed the surgery successfully. Till today she continues to be in touch with her Dr. Joshi, Dr. Dhruv Sir and Ketna Didi.

God-sent angel for her, Yusufbhai of Paraplegic Foundation (PF) at Sion transported her daily for therapy! Making new friends, she regained self-confidence again after a daily, rigorous routine of intensive physiotherapy that she is eternally grateful to her Drs. Srilekha, Joshi, Ram and our Dr. Dhruv Mehta. Infection that came up every eight days stopped with inputs of hygiene. Her friend Aparna was 'Annapoorneshwari' to send home-cooked food through her sister-in-law. Her mother, Yadnyakalabai, who was only used to their home in the village adjusted to a new way of life in Sion - by learning to cross roads in Mumbai (and we know how hard it is!), bringing non-veg food as this would be more nutritious for her (for one who never touched non-veg food) and much more. No wonder, she emphatically states that she is the world's best Mom. When time came to leave PF, Yusuf Bhai putting his hand on her head said that she had made such an impact on its inmates that she was leaving all of them very sad. She recalls great memories of PF and Mrs. Sulabha Varde, fondly called as Sulabbatai, who would always pat her on the back, encouraging her to walk more on its corridors, always remembering to inquire about her well-being that made her stay at PF more memorable and make time just fly.

She also vividly recalls in 2008, how Dr. Dhruv Mehta, at his own expense, took all of them at Paraplegic Foundation for a seminar that Nina Foundation had organized in which our Trustee, Dr. Sharad Sagade



spoke on urological problems faced by SCIs and how they can be better handled. She, too, presented her problems to **Dr. Sagade** that he resolved and of how Ketna went to her table reassuring her assistance at any time and encouraging her to be confident and persevering. It is because of Ketna's continuous advice that has enabled her to take one day at a time even today.

For exercise, she still walks with calipers for an hour everyday. To sit down and get up, she needs assistance that is given without complaint by her family. She says that her family supports her, encourages her and gives her courage, her **Bhabhi**, **Sharada** and **Sucheta** who are like sisters to her give her all the gossip and keep her updated on all matters! They are the spine of her life. She helps with cutting vegetables and is the first to fondly be given yummy food made in their kitchen! Her only prayer is she may get these same people in future lifetimes too.

Alphonse Karr says, "Some people are always grumbling because roses have thorns; I am thankful that thorns have roses." This is what our Rajshri Patil is, A beautiful ROSE! She believes first step towards success is taken when you refuse to be a captive of the environment you first find yourself in, be persevering in your dreams to become reality and that one must stand up and try again after a fall. Rabindranath Tagore said, "Clouds come floating into my life, no longer to carry rain or usher storm, but to add color to my sunset sky." A true winner through her grit and determination has colored her sunset sky only to reassure her that a happy and beautiful dawn is awaiting her!

We, at Nina Foundation, heartily wish you dear Rajshri with Divine Grace and Blessing that the sun may never set on the horizon of your life, to always stay happy and continue to spread sunshine in others' lives too.



Counselling, solutions, ideas and a unique management approach to continue with their education, employment, vocation, family life or take up new interests like volunteering, sports, home-based activities to become self-reliant and to become financially independent. Nina Foundation also offers a stipend to help with our NGO activities for six months to a year. Once confident they are encouraged to take up commercial jobs. PROFILE

SHRI HIRALAL KHATIK



Hiralal Khatik was working as a Loco-pilot at the Igatpuri division of Indian Railways and was on duty on December 14, 2000, the day of the incident. It was a foggy winter morning when Khatik was crossing the railway line, and he got hit by a speeding engine and got rolled over.

With injuries all over including Spinal Cord Level T12, Khatik was rushed to the local hospital, then Kalyan hospital and finally to Byculla hospital where he got operated post 6 days to be told by the Doctor - "This is your state. You can't stand on your feet. You have to live with it."

A positive Khatik mentions, "I had a fracture in my hand also and hence got operated with a rod inserted, but since then my hands are fine. There's no problem with my hands."

Khatik started with rehabilitation at AIIPMR at Hajiali where he overcame his bed sores.

So, was it spinal cord injury that he fought against? No. He made it his friend. But his real fight was with the System, A team of doctors at the Railway board that declared him as "Unfit for all kind of services in Indian Railways" thus rendering him jobless.

As Khatik says, "There's a limit for accepting things."
He started realising that nothing is going to result sitting at home. Until when? He needed to fight and his fight would require him to move out of his comfort zone,

and make efforts be it stretching himself all the way to Delhi. He fought relentlessly for 6 years until came the decision of CCD, Delhi and then the High Court agreed, Khatik shouldn't have been retired from service. Justice was served immediately and he was taken back to service in IRs.

Rehabilitation for Khatik is "Try to remain busy". He would explore all possible means to keep his mind and body indulged in some or the other activity, as is indicated by his particular time schedule with a particular time slot allotted for every daily activity including an hour for helping out his wife in the kitchen...!!!

All through the past and present, Khatik says "My wife has been the true source of motivation, inspiration and support".

As during the days when the tragedy struck, she got a cradle tied for their 2 months' old kid at the hospital but stood firmly besides him at each and every stage and dedicated herself entirely for my cause.

A satisfied Khatik who just a few days back threw a grand celebration for his completing 25 years in service tells about his expectations from life, "Nothing much. I just want to complete my entire term of service, see the prosperity of my family and after that I would like to devote myself for the betterment of friends with SCI." Noble thought indeed!
